In the spirit of St. Patrick's Day, this article spotlights some dog breeds that originate from Ireland. These breeds include Irish Setters, Irish Wolfhounds, Irish Terriers, Wheaten Terriers and Kerry Beagles. All of these have unique qualities that were used for various purposes in Ireland. One of the oldest dog breeds is the Irish Wolfhound. It's suggested they have existed all the way back to 7000BC. They were originally bred and domesticated to hunt wolves, hence how the breed got it's name. They were even used as war dogs in the past. They are a very large and powerful dog making them good for hunting. They are the tallest standing dog



of all dog breeds in the world. The Kerry Beagle is another breed that dates back many, many years. This breed is even believed to be a descendant of the Irish legend, Celtic Hounds. The Kerry Beagle was used as a scent hunter to track fox and hare. Irish Terriers are considered to be one of the oldest terrier breeds. They were bred for their working qualities and gameness. Now they are a popular family dog that have a great fondness for children. Wheaten Terriers are another breed that were a popular farm dog in Ireland. They were used for keeping varmints off farmers land. Irish Setters are another popular hunting dog. They're unique quality is their point. When hunting they track their prey by scent and when on a trail will freeze and "point" in the direction of their prey.
